

# Schedule B Environmental Assessment Notice of Study Completion

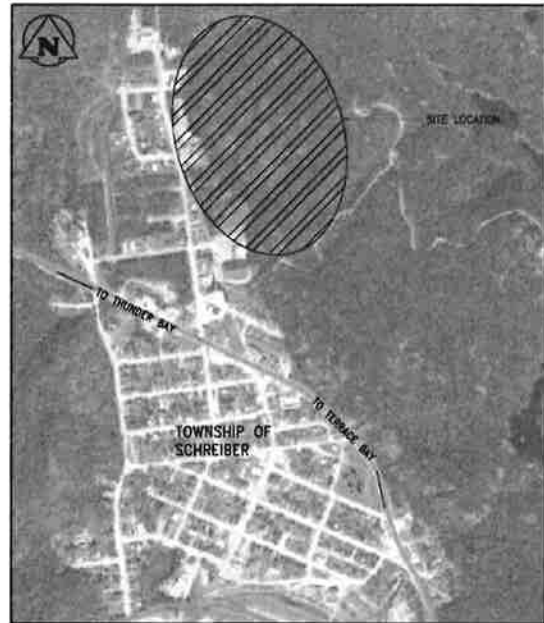


## TOWNSHIP OF SCHREIBER MUNICIPAL CLASS ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT WATER TREATMENT PLANT CLEARWELL AND PLANT UPGRADES PROJECT

**The Study** – The Township of Schreiber is assessing the problem of providing treated water during high flow events (ie. fire fighting activities) and maintenance activities. The proposed solution is the development of a new treated water reservoir. The project consists of upgrades to the Water Treatment Plant (ie. electrical and mechanical) and construction of a reservoir. Alternatives considered for the project include construction of a reservoir with sufficient elevation to allow for gravity feed to the Township at the same pressure as water currently leaving the plant, and construction of a reservoir at a location which would require pumping.

### Study Area

**Environmental Assessment Process** - The project is being planned under Schedule B of the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) (October 2000, as amended in 2007, 2011 and 2015) which is approved under the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act. This notice indicates the start of the Class EA, a study that will define the problem, identify and evaluate solutions, and determine a preferred alternative in consultation with the public, stakeholders and regulatory agencies. The Township is inviting public comment on the proposal to address the proposed project of upgrading the Water Treatment Plant to include a new treated water reservoir. The Class EA includes public, stakeholder and regulatory agency consultation, evaluation of alternatives, assessment of potential environmental effects and identification of mitigation measures for potential adverse effects.



**Public Participation** – The EA is available for review at the following locations: Township of Schreiber Municipal Office (Front Desk), 204 Alberta Street, Schreiber ON P0T 2S0 (Mon to Fri: 8:30 am to 4:00 pm; Tel: 807-824-2711) and the Schreiber Public Library located at 314 Scotia Street, Schreiber ON P0T 2S0 (Sun & Mon: Closed, Tues & Thurs: 10 am – 5 pm & 7 – 9 pm; Wed & Fri: 10 am – 5 pm and Sat: 1 pm – 5 pm; Tel: 807-824-2477).

Interested persons should provide written comment to the Township on the EA within 30 calendar days from the date of this Notice (July 4, 2017). Comments should be directed to the CAO/Clerk. If concerns arise regarding this project, which cannot be resolved in discussion with the Township, a person or party may request that the Minister of the Environment and Climate Change make an order for the project to comply with Part II of the Environmental Assessment Act (referred to as a Part II Order), which addresses individual environment assessments. Requests must be received by the Ministry at the addresses below within 30 calendar days of this Notice (August 4, 2017). A copy of the request must also be sent to the CAO/Clerk. If there is no request received by August 4, 2017, the Water Treatment Plant Clearwell and Upgrades project will proceed to design and construction as presented in the Environmental Assessment.
